Background

The Paris Peace Settlement was a compromised peace.

The Treaty of Versailles was not a clear expression of realism, nor was it a clear expression of rationalism. The Paris Peace Settlement was an uncomfortable compromise between realism and rationalism.

The Treaty of Versailles resolved the First World War between Germany and the Allies, but it also caused major problems.
