Introduction

Welcome to History 12.

This will be your first real taste on international politics . . . the raw workings of power between nations. This is a course about decision making on a global scale!

History 12 is an exploration of the most important developments during the 20th Century. This course centers on the relationships between nation states, and therefore we tend to focus on diplomatic and military history. This semester you will study the global impact of the First World War, Paris Peace Settlement, Great Depression, Second World War, and the Cold War. You will also study important developments in China, India, and the Middle East, plus the Civil Rights Movement.

The primary object of this course is to provide a disciplined study of the 20th century with a continued emphasis on critical thinking skills. An important goal of this course is to develop a lifelong interest in real history, which will result in a much deeper understanding of current world events.

This class will require a decent amount of reading and writing, but if you work hard, this should be one of the most rewards courses you take at OKM! It will prepare you for university!
